As the largest collaborative platform for sharing ethical supply chain data, Sedex is an innovative and effective supply chain management solution that helps Domino to improve our supply chain practices. It also eases the burden on suppliers facing multiple audits, questionnaires and certifications, and contributes to the continual improvement of the social and environmental conditions in our supply chain.

Sedex is an online database which allows companies to store and view data on ethical and responsible business practices. Sedex does not set any standards or determine the policy of its members. It is purely a tool for facilitating access to information. Sedex stores information on ethical and responsible practices covered by ILO Conventions, ETI Base Code, SA 8000, ISO 14001 and industry specific codes of conduct. Sedex members can use the information on the system to evaluate suppliers against any of these codes or the labour standards provisions in individual corporate codes. Sedex itself does not specify a particular code or state that suppliers have 'passed' or 'failed'.

EcoVadis provide a system to allow organisations to evaluate their own and their supply chain’s Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) levels.

EcoVadis is an independent CSR assessment agency. Its unique CSR assessment methodology covers 150 purchasing categories, 110 countries, and 21 CSR indicators. The methodology is also built on international CSR standards including the Global Reporting Initiative, the United Nations Global Compact, and the ISO 26000.

EcoVadis assesses suppliers from 110 countries and across 150 business sectors on corporate policies, initiatives and achievements in areas concerning the Environment, Labour Practices, Fair Business Practices, and Supply Chain.

Many global companies are eager to improve both their own sustainability record, and sustainability in their supply chain as well.

The sustainability performance of suppliers has become an important factor for supplier selection. It is also becoming increasingly common that customers request Domino's sustainability data as part of their supplier selection process and often request the EcoVadis assessment.

Domino continues to monitor and assess its environmental impact to identify ways to improve its sustainability performance across all areas of the business.
